Program Overview

This will help bridge gaps between countries by promoting international teamwork and collaboration between generations. The SIAC “Emerging Leaders” program brings together renowned international faculty members with a cohort of rising cardiologists and students from the American continent to embark on a collaborative learning journey.

Aims of Emerging Leaders Program

- To create a collaborative team of young (under 35 years of age) cardiologists and students and foster their skills and talents through research and educational activities.
- To promote publications and presentations of group members in international journals and scientific sessions.

Program Activities

Virtual:

- **Skill building:** Online courses on leadership, clinical research, and scientific writing/publishing,
- **Networking:** To build successful mentoring relationships between Emerging Leaders, former members of the program, and international SIAC faculty.
- To write **summaries and editorials** on high impact research articles, to be published on the SIAC website.
- To participate in the writing of **SIAC Scientific Statements/Guidelines**.
- To design and lead at least 1 (one) research project.

In-Person (At the Annual SIAC Conference):

- To present abstracts, posters, and clinical cases.
- To participate as speakers and/or panelists in the different sessions according to the “emerging leader’s” area of interest
